The Sanctuary “Origami Peace Crane” installation will be migrating soon!

Since Advent a flight of paper cranes has enlivened our sanctuary, but they will soon be moving on. Look for a chance to take one with you to share our message of peace on April 28 at the conclusion of worship.

Some highlights of this addition to our worship environment in retrospect:

- * Ruth Sall envisioned this installation and many volunteers helped give it flight. Such an installation, artistic and evocative in nature, inspired different meaning for each observer but some aspects that informed this project include:
- * The project began with shared teaching and folding at a potluck dinner with international peacemaker, Rev. Manolis Ntamparakis.
- * The work of so many hands and the ephemeral nature of paper parallels the necessary shared work for and fragility of peace.
- * Dozens of church members and friends have folded cranes included here, much like Michael Pendry’s travelling international installation of folded paper doves “Les Colombes” (coming soon to New York).
- * Many children (and adults) have read “Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes” by Eleanor Coerr (1977) about the tradition of hope attached to the making of cranes in Japanese tradition and which adorn the centerpiece statue in Hiroshima Peace Park.
