

Masks are now optional in church facilities (except masks are required when singing).

However, masks are required for all who want to sit in the full-time mask section of the sanctuary on the lectern-side rear portion (section where the video equipment is) This section will still use the color-coded guidance for social distancing.

Other areas of the sanctuary are set for an every-other-pew plan for seating, allowing for social distancing.




