

Summer Sunday School is finished. Classes will resume in the September. 18th




Nursery Care— is offered for children birth through toddler in the nursery and the toddler rooms (110 and 112)

All are welcome - come and add your voice to this important conversation. A light snack will be provided.


Be a part of the ushering team at APC
