

At its January 25, 2023, meeting, the APC Session took several actions that will impact the congregation over the next twelve months.

- On the advice of the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry, Session approved the recruitment of a Bridge Pastor to serve the interim between Pastor Kirby's retirement on April 9 and the installation of a new Head of Staff, likely in fall 2023. The team of Jeff Bates, Chair, Bill Gustafson, Tiffany Clark, and Michelle Feil were assigned recruitment with the goal of filling the position within the April 16, 2023 time span.
- In the same action, Session postponed recruitment of an Associate Pastor until the Head of Staff position is filled.
- To provide coverage for pastoral care in the new staffing alignment, Session approved recruiting a Parish Associate for ten hours per week to augment pastoral care. The position is projected to commence as soon as discernment leads to an appropriate candidate for the position. A team composed of Ed Messina, representing Congregational Life Council, and Charlotte Dean and Ray Rife, representing Personnel Council are the recruiting team.
- Session affirmed continued support for the work of the Designated Pastor Nominating Committee.
- Session approved recruitment of a part-time Facilities Manager to oversee the maintenance of the facilities. A recruiting team of Property Committee and Personnel Council members is managing this recruitment.
- The Session also adopted a resolution to develop a plan to increase membership, improve stewardship and educate membership on setting up bequests. Targeted implementation for a plan would be late summer.

With the retirement of Pastor Kirby, and the realignment of staffing positions, the next twelve months will be a challenging period for APC. It is a period during which congregational members can support the various committees with prayer, suggesting possibilities of potential candidates and patience for the process to unfold under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.


APPORTIONMENT FOR 2023


