Janáček, a Czech composer, is one of the most important exponents of musical nationalism in the 20th century. *Zápisník zmizelého* (The Diary of One Who Vanished) is a narrative song cycle of 22 songs written for tenor and piano, with 3 of the numbers featuring also a mezzo-soprano and a backstage trio of singers. The poems first appeared in a newspaper in Brno, which were printed anonymously and were supposedly found by the father of a young man who had abandoned his home and country for a gypsy woman. The music and the words together portrayed the struggle of the young man and his transformation to form his new family with the gypsy. This performance will be sung in Czech, preceded by a short lecture on the composer, background, and story of the songs to deepen the experience for listeners.


